






Your child is a COVID close contact, now what?

Dearborn Public Schools follows the quarantine guidance from the Wayne County Health Department, outlined below. Note, your child can also be a close contact for exposure outside of school, including if someone else in the home tests positive for COVID.



Is your child...

 <p>Fully vaccinated</p> <p><i>It has been at least two weeks since the second shot of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine or one shot of Johnson & Johnson vaccine</i></p>	<p>No quarantine required</p> <p><i>Monitor for symptoms for 14 days and stay home and get tested if symptoms develop.</i></p>
 <p>Had COVID-19</p> <p><i>Had a positive COVID-19 test in the last five months, but are no longer in isolation.</i></p>	<p>No quarantine required</p> <p><i>Must submit the positive PCR test results or a positive rapid test with a doctor's note confirming student had symptoms.</i></p> <p><i>Monitor for symptoms for 14 days and stay home and get tested if symptoms develop.</i></p>
 <p>No vaccination + Masks were worn by close contact and COVID positive case + 3 to 6 feet social distance*</p>	<p>No quarantine required</p> <p><i>Monitor for symptoms for 14 days and stay home and get tested if symptoms develop.</i></p>
 <p>No vaccination + Masks were worn by close contact and COVID positive case + 3 feet or less social distance*</p>	<p>Quarantine for 10 days</p> <p><i>Monitor for symptoms for 14 days and stay home and get tested if symptoms develop.</i></p>
 <p>No vaccine + No mask for either close contact or COVID positive case</p>	<p>Quarantine for 10 days and get tested if symptoms develop</p> <p><i>For example, if contact was on the 8th, you must quarantine THROUGH the 18th. Return to school is allowed on the 19th.</i></p>
