School Soft Start Procedure for Kindergarten

Dearborn Public Schools is initiating a "Soft Start" program for incoming kindergarten students. The purpose of the Soft Start program is to provide shorter days and an introduction to the kindergarten teacher and of your child's school on a part time schedule for the first week of school. The goal is to ensure the kindergarten start is positive and successful for all students. This is an exciting time in the lives of children and families. Our goal for Soft Start is to make the start to school successful for all students. Thank you for your patience with the part time schedule. **This is effective only for the first week of school.**

Regular School Day Procedure for Grades K-5

Starting Tuesday, August 27 students will be served breakfast at 8:25 AM. Students are expected to use appropriate behavior during breakfast and lunch. We are committed to creating a positive learning environment and being part of a community which cares for its children and their education. Together we will work to create a strong elementary school and help your children grow and learn in many ways.

Help your child to prepare for the back to school schedule at home. Elementary students should get 10 to 12 hours of sleep each night. Move bedtime earlier so that getting up for the first week of school won't be so difficult.

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All students who arrive to school before 8:45 go to breakfast through door # 5 in the playground. (Students will be monitored by school staff, so there is no need to stay with them).

- After eating breakfast students will exit the cafeteria through door #5 and walk to his/her respective spot.
- Kdg teachers will pick up their students from the cafeteria.
- Late arrivals must be buzzed in through door #1

Please be sure to wait outside for your child at dismissal time. The teachers will walk students out to their designated doors at 3:55. Older siblings in different grades are encouraged to walk around the building to the younger sibling's door to meet the parents.

Please do not block the crosswalks, bus loading zones, or stop in the middle of the street to let your child out of the vehicle. Student Safety comes first! Traffic around the school is one way during entry and dismissal time. We need your help to ease the traffic congestion. We need to maintain a safe school for our children. Your help is needed and greatly appreciated.

Attendance



The entry bell will sound at 8:55 AM, the tardy bell will ring at 9:00 and classes will begin promptly at 9:00 am. Students will be marked **tardy** when coming to school after that time. Students are to line up at their assigned door, with their class. Students are not to come early to school to play. The playground is not supervised before school.

Students arriving after 9:00 must sign-in at the office so that their attendance can be changed from absent to late.

Regular school attendance is in your child's best interest. There is a clear correlation between good attendance and academic achievement. Students need to attend school to fully maximize their educational opportunities. In addition, the law in Michigan governing compulsory attendance requires a parent, legal guardian, or other person having control or charge of a child age six to sixteen, shall be required to send such child to the public school during the entire school year except under limited circumstances.

Starting the summer vacation before the end of the school year or taking a vacation in the middle of the school year is NOT in your child's best educational interest. Therefore, this is considered an unexcused absence.

Maples School has a procedure in place for addressing excessive absences/tardiness. After any student has shown a pattern of unexcused absences, parents will be contacted to discuss the issue. If absences continue, a letter will be sent to the parent/guardian. The letter will be a gentle reminder of the importance of regular school attendance. Subsequent letters will be sent for additional absences. All of these contacts are to assure that home and school are working together on the issue of attendance. One outcome of numerous absences, even if they are excused, is for the school to require a doctor's excuse for each absence. This is an extreme measure used only in extreme situations. In addition, unexcused absences can lead to a truancy referral to Student Services.

Please call 827-6451 to report your child's absence during the year. We are looking forward to a great school year!
